MARY AND THE GRACE OF VISITATION

After the angel delivered the message, the bewildered Mary took off immediately to visit Elizabeth not because she disbelieved the angel's message about Elizabeth's pregnancy but was overjoyed with desire and was eager to fulfil a duty of piety. They were in each other's company in an extraordinary way by the presence of the Holy Spirit so much so that the woman recognised the woman's arrival, and the child recognised the child's arrival. It would have been easy for Mary to say "I am going to be the mother of the Lord, so let the whole world come and visit me." No, but she was humble to go visit Elizabeth to give her physical, emotional, and spiritual support, and to share in her joy.

As Christmas draws closer, let us open ourselves to receive from the Holy Spirit that same intensity and humility "to set out in haste" to touch others with the Divine presence. In our act of reaching out to others in love, God is present. In our visits to the sick, God is also present. In our visits to those struggling with anxiety and bereavement, God is present. ADVENT WREATH: The Advent Wreath is made from evergreen leaves that are woven around a circle of wire. A purple ribbon is then wound around the leaves. Three purple candles and one pink candle are placed on the Wreath. The circle of evergreen leaves represents God who is without beginning or end. The fourth candle represents peace and is called the "Angel's Candle." The angels announced that Jesus came to bring peace—He came to bring people close to God and to each other again. This colour is also purple to represent the culmination of love through the Messiah.
